- Liability shields, such as LLCs and other business entities, and how to separate owner assets from company assets by creating them
- Additional insured coverage, contractual indemnification obligations, and liability for both general contractors and subcontractors

SAFETY NATIONAL GRANT

In the construction industry, people are constantly reaching their arms up to complete various tasks, making it a common occurrence that many don't think twice about. However, the constant repetition of this same movement can lead to debilitating injuries such as sprains and strains. These long-term traumatic injuries negatively impact the quality of life for those who experience them.

At The Builders Group, our Safety Professionals work with our members to provide training, job site inspections, and a pathway to the latest safety technology.

While looking for emerging safety technology that could benefit our members, we came across an exciting opportunity via our reinsurance partner, Safety National. To promote workplace safety, they host a cost-sharing safety grant contest awarding first, second, and third-place winners up to \$10,000. The program focuses on assisting partners in acquiring new, highly valuable safety equipment to help eliminate and control existing safety issues their insureds face.

With much enthusiasm, TBG accepted the first-place award amongst more than 70 other applicants!

"With each entry, we looked at how the solution would impact risk reduction. We looked for innovation and the solution's viability over the long run. Finally, we looked at the impact the solution might have in the workplace," said Ed Pratt, Director of Risk Management for Midlands. "These and other factors were considered, graded, and tabulated, with TBG coming out as the winner for 2022. Midlands and Safety National are proud of our long-term relationship and look forward to working with Adam and his team for years to come."

TBG invested the \$10,000 prize in two innovative technologies: manual material-handling exoskeletons and virtual reality training technology. We wanted to invest in these technologies based on injury trends in the construction industry, exposures our members face in the field, and the industry's best practices. Doing so provides our members with sprain/strain control solutions.

It's no secret that the construction industry is experiencing a shortage of qualified labor and an aging workforce. To address this challenge, the exoskeleton system helps offset repetitive wear-and-tear on employees who perform overhead work.

"TBG never loses focus on returning injured workers to the job," Safety National Vice President Janna Preston said. "Their Safety Service team members are innovators looking for ways to reduce exposures, having a positive impact on accident frequency and severity while working directly with TBG members."

The exoskeletons TBG purchased with the grant will travel with our Safety Service team members across the state and be loaned out free of charge to our members. We want to help them make as much of a positive impact as possible and give them time to understand the full value of employee health and safety.

We also used the grant to purchase additional Humulo Virtual Reality Training Technology. These VR headsets contribute to our mission of finding new and innovative ways to make our training more valuable to our members and their employees. This technology creates an immersive, real-world training environment, requiring active participation that employees can implement as they transition onto jobsites.

With the headsets, members can train on various topics like fire safety, general hazard awareness, fall protection, struck-by, caught-in or -between, electrical hazards, and forklift training. Providing immersive training in these areas will help better prepare employees for the hazards they face. In addition, the headsets allow them to do this in a safe space conducive to learning from mistakes without suffering consequences.


